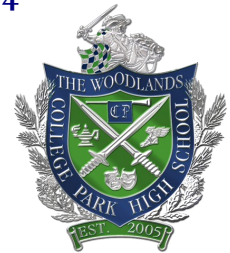

DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Conroe Independent School District covers an area of 348 square miles. More than 58,000 students attend five comprehensive high schools, seven junior high schools, three special program sites, including two magnet school programs, and numerous elementary and intermediate campuses making Conroe ISD the 71st largest district in the United States and the 14th largest district in the state.

The Woodlands, one of the nation's premier master planned communities, is home to more than 100,000 people. Nestled among 27,000 acres of lush forest, The Woodlands is just 27 miles north of downtown Houston and is an important regional center for more than 1000 businesses. Most residents in this upscale suburb are employed in professional or managerial positions with an average family income of \$110,000.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS-ACADEMY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

The Woodlands College Park High School houses the Academy of Science and Technology. The Academy is a group of students (75 per grade), competitively selected, whose curriculum focuses on science and technology. Academy students take their science, math, and technology classes within the Academy setting. Academy teachers work collaboratively with the faculty and staff of The Woodlands College Park High School to enhance the curriculum and special interests of Academy students.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

The Woodlands College Park High School's school day consists of a traditional seven period day with each period approximately 50 minutes. Students at College Park are expected to graduate on the Texas Recommended or Distinguished Achievement Program which require 4 credits in English, 4 credits of Math (to include Algebra 2), 4 credits of Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Principles of Technology, and 1 additional science), 4 credits of Social Studies, 2 or 3 credits of Foreign Language, a fine arts course, one credit of physical education, Health, and a speech class, Communication Applications. Class rank is based on the cumulative grade point average for grades 9-12. A student's grade point average is determined by dividing the total number of grade points by the number of semester courses attempted. All state accredited courses are considered in the calculation. Grade points are awarded according to course rigor.

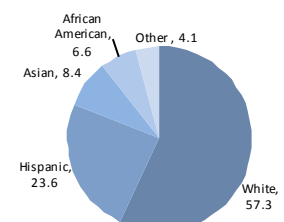

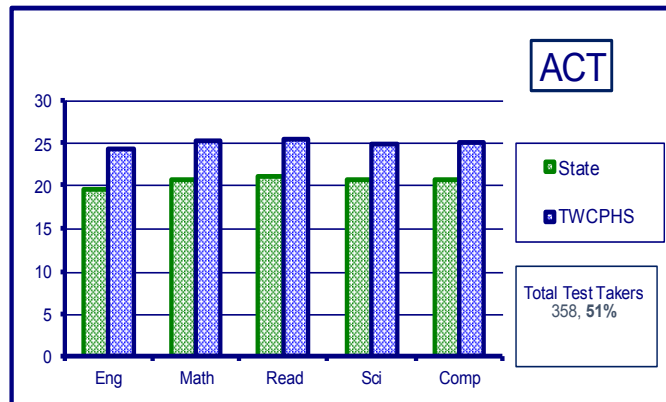
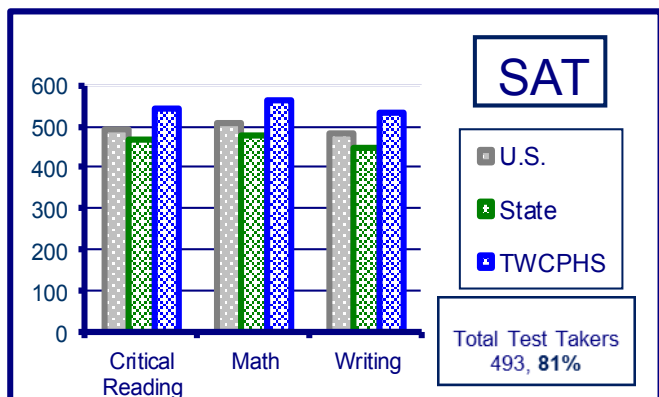
